WHAT IS APPRECIATIVE INQUIRY?

Appreciative Inquiry is designed to encourage us to look at St. Brendan's with an "appreciative eye," to identify the good that already exists, and to figure out how to build on it as we discern together who God is calling St. Brendan's to be and what God is calling us to do.

1. WHAT'S OUR STORY? Sharing stories about our experience at St. Brendan's:

2. WHAT'S OUR DNA? Defining who St. Brendan's is today:

Culture Statement: St. Brendan's Episcopal Church is an open and welcoming community of faith. We seek to serve God and support each other through worship and faith in action in an atmosphere of love, friendship, and compassion.

3. WHERE IS GOD CALLING US?

Discerning how God is calling us to use our gifts going forward:

Existing Mission Statement: Jesus said, "I have come to give life—life in all its fullness" (John 10:10). Our mission is the realization of fullness through: the worship of God; service to the world; active concern for each other; and education to expand the mind and spirit.

Mission Focus Statement: We reaffirm this mission as we strive to:

- love and accept all people as our neighbors;
- nurture one another along our spiritual journeys through worship, formation, and community;
- walk beside those with needs, responding to a changing world without ceasing;
- spread the good news of God in Christ and share the good works God is doing at St. Brendan's.

Follow up with those who have left St. Brendan's to determine why they left.	Vestry
Support and encourage the growth of "in reaching" stewardships, including LEM, supper club, meal makers, etc. as well as "Invite, Welcome, Connect."	Vestry, Clergy

Foster and support ongoing outreach and encourage new ministries.	Vestry

Educate congregation about different methods of evangelism and create opportunities to engage in evangelism.	Education Committee, Clergy
Develop a "marketing strategy" for St. Brendan's to share our mission and our culture and to reach new people. Evaluate in reach and outreach activities to document their impact.	Communications Committee (Marketing/Publicity) Outreach Committee
