Priest's Corner: What Does a Church Do after an Easter Event?

If you are going to read this Priest's Corner, I'd like you to stop right now and get your Bible out and read five verses from Acts of the Apostles and then return. Are you game? Come on.... STOP! Go get your Bible NOW. Thank you. OK. Read these five verses: Acts: 6:7; Acts: 9:31; Acts: 12:24; Acts: 16:5; Acts: 19:20.

So what is the common theme running through all these verses? It can be summarized in these four words: "And the church grew...." Churches that truly experience Easter grow. The question for us to answer is: Has our church, St. Brendan's, experienced Easter? We all have to answer this question for ourselves, but let me tell you what your priest thinks. We sure did! I think the majority of you really committed to Lent, and you are now on the Road to Resurrection. Ask around. I'm told we had record numbers at the Holy Week services. Each service, except Good Friday, needed more service pamphlets printed. There's a spiritual hunger at St. Brendan's, and in the country, these days. Not sure what's causing it, but I think we need our sacred refuges, like our churches, to be the places where we can escape the craziness of narcissism and confusion. We need positivity and assurance that we are OK, and that there's a power greater than ourselves that has answers, serenity and growth for us.

Sure, we will have our ego-rants: "They still didn't fix that church door, and it never stays locked at the bottom!" "Those technology installers didn't give us the right cables for our new sound system." "Now that we've been given the new round tables, where do we store them?" Christ is risen! Alleluia! On our better days (51% of the time), we are really thankful to God that we have a church door. And we thank God that we received a grant to pay for half of a new sound system. And we thank God for people who gift us with new tables. St. Brendan's is 51-plus% Easter-ish! And because of that we will grow — just like the early church in Acts of the Apostles.
