The Priest's Corner

"The Cosmic Christ?"

We are exploring the notion of the "Cosmic Christ" in our Wednesday Lenten meditations and meager meal get-togethers. When I hear terms such as this, I experience the feeling of incompetence. My first thought is, "This is too far beyond me. I'm incapable of grasping it."

But then I'm confronted with the fact that the notion comes from Franciscan spirituality and has roots in Sts. Francis and Claire themselves. They were the simplest of souls. "Brother Sun, Sister Moon" is Francis' expression for the universe. It's so friendly, so much like "gently moving the caterpillar off the road so it doesn't get trampled under foot." Indeed from where or whom do humans get the permission to think they have more rights to the road than caterpillars? "Cosmic Christ" seems to suggest that we are more one with the universe than master over it.

"Cosmic Christ" is defined as that aspect of God which pervades all of creation, the Christ who "fills the universe in all its parts" (Ephesians 1:23). A way to grasp this concept might be this: "When God's Word, love aware of itself, comes pouring into nothingness, the universe happens." The Word of God in this way of thinking then begins not with the Bible but with the creation. The universe is the external embodiment of the Inner Word of God, and this is the meaning of "Cosmic Christ."

St. Bonaventure (a Franciscan theologian) concludes that every leaf, cloud, fruit, animal and person is to be seen as an outward expression of the Word of God in love! Thus each creature has its own identity, integrity and dignity. Christ is Word of God with a capital "W." Birds that serenade us, water that quenches our thirst, you and I – each creature is a word of God (with a small "w." All creation comes into existence because it (we) are spoken in love, by love itself!

So "Cosmic Christ" is Franciscan eco-spirituality. We Franciscan-types respect this earth-spirit. We believe that all creatures are intimately linked, cosmically connected. As one distinguished writer said, "Nothing can be itself without everything else." Every being somehow carries the divine (Cosmic Christ). Every being is basically sacred. If we truly believed this, we would change our ways, be more thoughtful, walk with a lighter step, and show our love and gratitude and concern for sister sparrow,

brother caterpillar, sister water, brother star and the rest of the family. To become this earth- and creation-sensitive is the challenge placed before us who are Franciscan at heart.
