The Priest's Corner

Reverse Projection

(3-30)

Thursday

Many suffer from a psychological condition called unhealthy or unsubstantiated projection. It's a kind-of-psychological defense mechanism whereby one estimates a future based on current trends or accumulation of facts. Now this can be a healthy approach especially if you have evidence to predict future trends or occurrences based on real factors in the present. These predictions can be helpful and may assist people in making great decisions regarding the unknown.

Where they can be unhelpful is when they create extraordinary fear and defeat in matters future. "I'll never lose enough weight to fit into my wedding dress by September." "We're never going to be able to have a decision by that date." "I don't think we'll be able to complete all the assignments on time and after I have the baby." Problem with these negative, self-defeating projections is that you're not accounting for all the life and discoveries you will add to yourself before you have to complete the assignments. You're not going into that future event with the same person you are today. You will have eight months of newness added to you when you get to the assignments. We make decisions about the future based on how we perceive ourselves today. We will not exactly be that same person when you get to the projected event in the future.

Now I do hear these sorts of future projections which more often than not result in self-sabotage before you're out the gate. No wonder we fail. Self-defeating prophecy is what we call this. STOP IT!. But the overwhelming projection stance most often I hear people reveal are the Reverse Projection types. Just yesterday I heard these words, "I wish we would have found St. Brendan's years ago." I also heard someone say, "Had I only moved to the North Hills when I wanted to 12 years ago, I would have my house paid off by now." Another, "If I knew then what I know now, I would never have married until I finished school."

These are common regrets, but you know what's so wrong about speaking these laments out loud? You are applying your skills and learnings accumulated today to situations that happened 14, 20, 30 years ago, when you were not in possession of the skills and abilities necessary to manage success all those years ago. You apply what you know now as operational when you met the situation so many years ago. You would like to have decided differently years ago, when you were not holding the knowledge you needed to make the decisive decisions.

So what should you do? Be gentle with yourself. You very likely did the best you could with the tools you had at the time. Forgive yourself for not being as equipped years ago as you wish you would have been ... and then MOVE ON into the present.
