The Priest's Corner

Living with Uncertainty

It is so good to be back at St. Brendan's. Even though my days at the church have their share of uncertainty to them, by and large I'm able to recognize a lot of predictability. I really do like predictability, but I've noticed that growth for me most often occurs when I need to interact with uncertainty.

Our last couple days in Florida were heaped with uncertainty. My aunt, whom we were transporting to Pittsburgh to catch a plane to NYC so she could tend to her sick brother, unexpectedly fell. We faced uncertainty as to what we should do next and what really happened to my aunt. How injured was she? I was certain of one thing: we had responsibility for her since she fell under our watch. Yet my mind raced with possible next steps, not at all sure which to take. It wasn't until today that we have some reasonable certainty that she likely will be fine.

A friend had a medical event recently. He was taken to the hospital and given an explanation of the obvious condition. However, my friend was uncertain about whether the condition was the final diagnosis or a symptom of another unknown condition. Uncertainty! How do you handle it?

In Bible study this week we read in Acts about prominent Jews who wanted to kill Paul for his thoughts about the resurrection of the dead. I asked the group what their concept of "what happens after we die?" means. How do you explain "the afterlife" to an inquirer? Are you unsure of what to say? I often am. There are two practical things to try.

First, what do we do when we are uncertain? Try looking over your life and check if you've ever had a similar doubt. If yes, notice how you made it through the doubt and were able to let it go. Acknowledge the evidence that caused you to make it through this past uncertainty. Consciously believe you will surely be able to make it through the latest uncertainty.

Second, when the uncertainty has a positive or negative outcome possibility deliberately choose the positive outcome, and act as if this positive outcome is the "for real" outcome. What do you have to lose?

In conclusion, remember the opposite of uncertainty is actually faith. Faith often is a choice. Faith trumps uncertainty. It's within your power to choose it over uncertainty. Wouldn't you agree?

Seeking Vestry Nominations. Would you like to be a candidate for St. Brendan's Vestry? The election will take place on January 27 at the parish's annual meeting. Candidates must be willing to serve for a term of three years.

St. Brendan's bylaws require vestry nominees to be baptized persons 16 years of age or older, financial contributors of record at least once within the past 12 months, and regular worshipers in the congregation for six months prior to the annual meeting.

Help for Haiti. Many of you know Isaac Mondelus, who is from Haiti and who is active at St. Brendan's. He personally provides financial aid to his family in Haiti and Brazil. There are not many jobs in Haiti and so he is purchasing a small truck to ship to Haiti to create jobs for his sister and other people. The truck will be converted for use as a taxi and his sister will run the business and hire a driver. The truck will be shipped to Haiti and he is asking for donations of used shoes and summer clothing which will be given away or sold, especially clothing for babies and young children. He is also collecting personal items: combs, soap bars, toothbrushes, toothpaste and plastic dishes. Used sewing machines are needed which can provide jobs for people to have to make school uniforms to sell. The workshops, sponsored by New Sanctuary Pittsburgh, are free and open to the public. They will be held January 22, 6:30 to 9:00 p.m., at St. Andrew Lutheran Church, 304 Morewood Ave., Pittsburgh. Child care will be available.

One training will provide information on how to provide legal accompaniment for impacted people as they interact with law enforcement, ICE, and the courts system. Bring your questions! You will learn how to accompany immigrants to ICE check-ins, court hearings, and other interactions with law enforcement or the courts.

The other training will focus on how to provide housing for impacted people. Learn to be a good host home, hear about some typical host home experiences, and learn how to become part of the critical team that offers housing in their homes and owned (but not occupied) properties.
