The Priest's Corner

With school starting and the sudden, cooler, weather, my thoughts turn to fall. Growing up in farm country, Erie County PA, late summer meant haying, and with school starting fall was a time of harvesting, hayrides, and preparing for winter. For the first time in 53 years, this fall I am not preparing to go to school. I recently quit being a college professor and took a full-time job as a hospice chaplain. So, this means for me, no more early morning drives watching the sun rise, no more late nights driving home watching the sun set. But more time with my family, more time for church, more time for just thinking and being. What this time gives me is more space just to be.

The first space is visual, my back yard. We have worked for years to reshape and reshape our back yard and we now have amazing flowers. The flowers attract butterflies and birds, so we have this sense of being in the garden as morning breaks over the trees.

Recently, I've been captivated by the morning fog rising off trees with columns of fog clinging tenaciously to the top branches. This creates a sense of other-worldliness. And I think, the clouds, the fog, the trees, and the light seem to be arranged just for me – and I hold my breath for a few moments hoping the moment doesn't end. It's a sight I see in mornings with heavy, dark gray clouds where the sun is breaking behind the clouds. I try to capture these mornings on my camera, but I realized I can only take a mental picture – but that way I have it with me always. With my time and lack of rush, I can say a prayer as I gaze on this vision. I wonder how anyone could question if there is a God or if creation is anything other than an outpouring of God's love for us, and sunrises and sunsets are daily expressions of that love.

The next space is sound – a lot of my memories link songs with events. This week, the hymn that keeps popping into my thoughts is "Morning has Broken" but Sinner Man (the Nina Simone version) is a close second. Each song reflects a different part of God's grace. These hymns remind me to be grateful to God for a wide variety of gifts. More importantly, these songs remind me that rest and sleeping are also gifts from, and gifts to, God. Resting rejuvenates me for labor and praise. The growth we get from sleeping is the physical growth of youth and the rejuvenating growth as we age.

I also think about how when we are helping others, caring for our neighbor, we are doing God's will. So as we prepare meals for others (the Merry Meal Makers and Meals for Myriams), collect food for North Hills Food Bank, or share meals at the Men's Breakfast our ministries are responding to how we started living into the commandment to help our neighbor in Deuteronomy that we find and aid those in our community or any town of the Lord who needs help and give them help. And we are to give this help with a joyous and open heart. By doing so, we live into Paul's prayer for us in Philippians that our love overflows more and more to help us determine that what is best is that which comes from God.

I find these songs comforting but they also allow us to acknowledge that some things confuse and confound us. Then just when we think we have the answer, almost any answer, it slips away or changes shape. But if we continue to seek those answers together, even if the truth still confounds us, we will find that love has found us. Thanks be to God.

It is in our making spaces that we find answers and peace then seek more answers. The intentional way we use music or a sunrise to bring us closer to God, also creates opportunities for us to be closer to and with each other.

St. Brendan's is seeking a volunteer to take on the task of preparing the Bulletin for our 10:00 am Sunday Eucharists.

For most of the year, this job demands about three hours of work a week and requires a certain degree of competence and confidence in using Word. The basic outline of the service changes little from one week to the next, but the readings cycle and Daniel's music selections naturally vary too. The appropriate materials are either provided by other Brendanites early in the week or are readily available to copy and paste from online sources. Once the first drafts have been assembled, a small group of proofreaders stand ready to read through them with eagle eyes.

Some bulletins can be more complex: those for services that include a baptism, for example; those for services on feast days like Christmas, Easter and Pentecost; and those for liturgies during Advent, Lent and Holy Week. These naturally involve additional time, but for these weeks, we also draw on a wider pool of volunteers to support whoever is serving as the primary coordinator.

Do you have a few hours a week at your disposal? Would you appreciate the ability to make a contribution to St. Brendan's worship services on your own schedule? Do you have average word processing skills? Do you work carefully and methodically? Then please give me a call. I am happy to answer questions and explain the process!



Have you ever heard someone say, "my lips are sealed"? I'll tell you but you have to keep it zipped?

And sometimes, when you do have a secret, if someone looks at you, you know they know exactly what you are thinking and the secret you have!!! And you think your brain will explode if you keep this secret any longer????

Maybe the secret is good news – maybe you are going on a vacation to Disney or to visit your favorite book location – like Prince Edward Island where *Anne of Green Gables* took place or Chincoteague where *Misty of Chincoteague* of happened. But to all of them - the little girl, her mother, the man who was deaf and his friends, Jesus said, "shhh, don't tell anyone."

Now how can anyone keep that secret? Especially because everyone could see their lives changed because of Jesus.

What do you think the healed people and their friends did? What about their family and friends? Do you think anyone followed Jesus' instructions? No! They told everyone about Jesus. They told people who Jesus was, that he did everything well and helped everyone – even people others didn't like!

Now Jesus had more people following him and wanting to be healed, but Jesus wanted to spread the message of God and love. What could he do? You have to check back in to find out what Jesus did.

Other items that are greatly appreciated are: bikes, cookware, tools, gardening tools, sewing machines, crutches, walkers, wheelchairs, cribs, pencils and pens, towels, bedding, sleeping bags, toothbrushes, toothpaste and bars of soap.
