The Priest's Corner

The Annual Visit of the Bishop to a Church

As most of you know by now and have hopefully marked on your calendars, we are having our Annual Visitation by our bishop on Sunday, May 12. This is an awesome event for a church, and it should cause us great energy and joy.

According to *An Episcopal Dictionary of the Church*, the bishop's official pastoral visit to a congregation of the diocese is a time honored tradition. Canon law requires every diocesan bishop to visit every congregation in his or her diocese at least once every three years. Our bishop does it yearly. The canonical purposes of a visitation are for the bishop to examine the condition of the congregation, oversee the clergy, preach, confirm, preside at the Eucharist, and examine parochial records. The BCP (Book of Common Prayer) also assumes that the bishop's visitation will be an occasion for baptism, and that the bishop will preside.

The bishop will begin his St. Brendan's visitation by presiding and preaching at the 8 a.m. liturgy. He will then have a continental breakfast while meeting with the Vestry. Next, he will preside and preach at the 10 a.m., a memorable liturgy with special music, a liturgical dance, a brief children's message and a special hymn (Down in the River to Pray) sung by the children, as well as 3 adult baptisms, 1 child baptism, 4 adult confirmations, and 9 receptions into the Episcopalian Church. (Three will be conducted by the bishop on Sunday; the other 6 will be acknowledged by the bishop on Sunday but celebrated the following week due to scheduling challenges.) We will have one other special recognition at the liturgy. You won't want to miss this.

After the liturgy, there will be a festive coffee hour. Coinciding with the bishop's visit, May 12 is also Mother's Day. The men of the parish decided at their recent Men's Breakfast to cook, prepare and serve a special Mother's Day coffee hour. This alone is worth your presence. These guys do an outstanding job. The bishop will likely have some observations to make and some encouraging, meaningful, closing words for us near the end of the meal.

Just so you know, our Bishop Dorsey McConnell has been our shepherd for about 5 years. He is an outstanding speaker, very personable, with a delightful sense of humor. He boasts about St. Brendan's often. He is pastorally connected to our parish

and asks me about people and specific happenings at our church that he follows every time I see him. Please seek him out and talk to him. He makes time for all people. There are so many interesting things to talk to him about, please spend some time with him.

You might find the following "fun fact" something to ask Dorsey about. The bishop's father was General John Paul McConnell, the sixth chief of staff of the U. S. Air Force, Washington, D.C. He was named Joint Chief by President Johnson in 1964 and served in this capacity during the Vietnam Nam War until 1969. As chief of staff of the U. S. Air Force, General McConnell served in a dual capacity. He was a member of the Joint Chiefs of Staff which, as a body, acts as the principal military adviser to the president, the National Security Council, and the secretary of defense. In his other capacity, he was responsible to the secretary of the Air Force for managing the vast human and materiel resources of the world's most powerful aerospace force.

Please mark your calendars and plan to join in on May 12. Bring your mother if she doesn't have a church to attend that's nearby. It will be awesome, and since all of you are awesome. Bring your awesomeness to this awesome Bishop's Visitation.

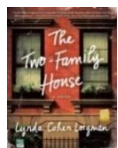

Book Club. (TONIGHT, Thursday, May 2, 7 p.m.)

Join the Book Club as we read "The Two-Family House" by Lynda Cohen Loigman, a debut novel that is an engrossing family saga set in post-war Brooklyn. The book focuses on two families that are inextricably linked by blood, marriage, and a long-held secret born in a snowstorm. St. Brendan's Scholarships. Bishop Dorsey McConnell Visits St. Brendan's. (Sunday, May 12)

Would anyone like to receive the sacrament of Confirmation when Bishop Dorsey McConnell visits St. Brendan's? The parish is considering a one-day retreat to prepare for the sacrament, which persons age 14 and up may receive. Parents are invited to consider along with their children the young person's readiness for this spiritual step into Christian maturity and leadership.
