The Priest's Corner

The Older I Get, the Better I Am with Inconsistency

Perhaps I should call this reflection today, "Inconsistency is Inevitable When Inclusivity and Diversity Are Your Goals"—instead of what I entitled it. I could also call it, "It Takes Hard Work to be Inclusive and Diverse." This pandemic has taught us so many things and provided us with "stretches" that perhaps were meant to break us only to end up helping us gain insights we never would have gained any other way. I learned there seems to be an impossible expectation of (better—demand for) consistency for those who opt for these two sought-after virtues—no wonder why so many give up trying to be inclusive and diverse at the same time. It is, as our nephew Micah would say, "dangit hard."

Then add being Episcopalian to the mix, and it's near impossible, or possible only when you let go of crippling perfectionism. You might be thinking, "What's Regis up to here—what's going on?" Simply put: in trying to be inclusive and diverse with opening up to full, in-person worship, we are experiencing how you can't really plan for every demand that inclusivity and diversity will request from you. For example, we knew that in order for parents to be best positioned to decide whether or not their unvaccinated kids return to in-person worship at St. Brendan's, we ought to give them reasonable, universal guarantees. Thus we determined that mask-wearing should be universal at all our services as well as up-to-date social distancing protocol guarantees. We expected some pushback. In fact, going into last Sunday, one piece of advice I received was, "Be ready— you're going to get resistance." Well you know what your sabotaging egoic, lower self does with all this foreboding, right!?!? You play out these epic dramas in your wide-awake mind but still sleeping body when you wake up in the middle of the night. It goes something like this: "She will say this...To which I will say...Then...He breaks out in tears...I resigned and they leave the parish....your alarm rings...real time arrives...yet that dog-gone heart of yours is still beating out of your chest....and for a moment you're glad you're alone!" Tell me you don't know what I'm talking about? I call this "skin in the game."

So you get to church and everyone's masked and doing what you asked them to do. And you say in your heart, "Of course, this is St. Brendan's!" So you let people know how grateful you are and this too will end, and even if you can't see the vision...it's there and all this inconvenience too will pass. So I then get the insight there's one more inconsistency I want to take care of. All our readings and prayers will be done masked because even if you can't hear them as well due to the reader's mask, you have the bulletin or insert to follow. There's supportive tools along the way to make sure you hear the words.

Now: Enter perfectionism. "The only place then where you might be disadvantaged if mask-wearing is demanded everywhere is at sermon time. I know I sound muffled and there's no script to follow. So, you might experience an inconsistency and I want to give you a choice here. I can preach from behind the altar at the 8 and be maskless so you can hear, or we could go sermonless during the 8 o'clock because it will be live streamed any way...." Before I could finish, shouts of, "No! Of course not! Sermon at 8...YOU WILL PREACH!" "Holy cow! What church does this?" St. Brendan's, of course! This is why it's going to be so hard for me to retire.

So we're a bit inconsistent. By the way, at 10, we're preaching maskless too; except in the big church, we're preaching from the pulpit. Oh how I don't want to do that, but I gotta have skin in the game too.

So after all this consistency/inconsistency work, I thought we had it together with the exceptions and learned to let perfectionism go a bit while welcoming the world of mere "high standards." No sooner was the sermon done, a frail-sounding voice fearfully was heard, "I can't breathe." ""Oh my goodness...take off her mask. Help her. Get some air." St. Brendan's intuitively knew what to do and all became well.

Later that day, it dawned on me how God seemed to punctuate the sentence one degree clearer, making the point perfectly enough; so that we all got the message. A little inconsistency is important, yinz all!" It won't tarnish your great plans or virtue attempts—it simply adds a bit of diversity to it, so you can really opt to be inclusive.



On June 26, 2021, Reverend Dr. Ketlen Solak was selected as Bishop-elect for the Episcopal Diocese of Pittsburgh. Two of St. Brendan's deputies who took part in the election process offered these remarks on the occasion:



"Rev. Dr. Kelten Solak was voted by the lay deputies and clergy to be the 9th bishop of the Episcopal Diocese of Pittsburgh. From what I have seen, she is humble, loves God, and has a variety of experiences with parishes. She appears to be someone who will collaborate with people and will listen to what people are experiencing. She has a spark and a beautiful singing voice that may have developed from her Haitian roots and as a music major in college. At our meet-and-greet session at Christ Church North Hills, it surprised everyone in the room that when asked to say a prayer, she chose instead to sing the prayer with a call-and-response interaction with all of us singing with her. She is very spiritual, and I am looking forward to her installation as our next Bishop." - Joyce Donadee
