The Priest's Corner

Anti-Racism/Black Lives Matter Parish Meeting

I've had some stressful days, a few rough days and maybe two bad days in my three years at St. Brendan's, so, in all, maybe a total of a dozen, less-than-desirable days. This then leaves over a thousand good, great or super great days at St. Brendan's in that time. Our Total-Parish, Anti-Racism/Black-Lives-Matter meeting last night, though, ranks right up there with my best-three-days-ever. It was a fantastic, awesome night. It was thrilling to be pastor of this wonderful, dedicated, with-it parish.

First of all, we had double the participation I expected: 44 people attended via Zoom. Prior to our suspension of public worship, we were averaging between 110-150 people on Sundays. Forty-four volunteer attendees at an Anti-Racism Parish Meeting on a Wednesday night is not only impressive, but also means we got between 22-34% attendance. That's unbelievable; but after all, **We are St. Brendan's!** Participants included new Brendanites, live-streamers who just met us over the past months because we started on-line worship and founders of St. Brendan's along with ESL volunteers. We had the chair of our Diocesan Justice & Peace Committee present as well as a representative from the Diocesan Anti-Racism Commission. We had parishioners from Florida and soon-to-be parishioners from Pottstown, PA. Already, at least five additional parishioners have taken the time to express not only why they couldn't attend, but to submit long recommendations for what they think we need to do about racism and Black Lives Matter in our country, state, city and church. Last night's expression, I'd say, indicates we not only have a concerned church, but we have a church that actually turns thoughts into actions.

It was our first large meeting done through Zoom with six break-out rooms. This whole new technological experiment went off as if we have been doing these contemporary ways of collaborating for years. The evening came about because six concerned parishioners approached Tim or me within days of George Floyd's public murder to express their clear need to "do something" about our current systemic racism. Our Justice Ministry then called a joint meeting of the two life streams of racial-equality activism within the church. These 13 people gave life to this social justice movement at St. Brendan's and our outstanding total-parish meeting last night.

Some highlights from last night's meeting with a promise of much more to come:

- We reviewed and added to the developing **Living Document for Action Steps against Racism**. This is a list of actions every Brendanite can personally commit to doing immediately. The document also lists corporate action steps against racism we can take as a church. (Stay tuned as to how you can access the latest version of this document.)
- Over 20 parishioners committed publicly to "the 9-day anti-racism challenge." This is an expressed, accountability-partnered commitment to participate in a communal, focused, Black Lives Matter behavior each day for 9 days. - Strong support for St. Brendan's to partner with a black church, to rejoin PIIN (Pittsburgh Interfaith Impact Network) and to display a Black Lives Matter banner on our church grounds was voiced. Two parishioners offered to cover all the costs for PIIN membership and the Black Lives Matter banner.
- We have established an Education Coordination Team overseen by Virginia Volponi at (ginny4045@gmail.com). This
 group meets weekly to examine and make available relevant Racism and Black Lives Matter material to the parish. Please

send your educational findings/discoveries to the email address highlighted above and these will be explored. This team will offer regular Zoom training opportunities for the parish and submit a weekly relevant fact, explanation or development to *The Little Log* or email blast.

Vestry Meeting. The Vestry held its monthly meeting—using Zoom, of course—on Monday, June 8. It will come as no surprise that three topics dominated our discussions. We heard first from the Working Group that is examining how we will reopen St. Brendan's for in-person worship when the time is right. We were able to offer some comments on an early draft of the parish questionnaire that you will all be receiving shortly. This led to consideration of the challenges we will face in continuing to live-stream our services while also having a limited number of parishioners present in the sanctuary; technological upgrades were approved to ensure that we will be able to do so safely and effectively. Finally, we talked about the need felt by many to participate in the national conversation about racial inequity and police brutality. Leadership in that area is being provided by our Justice Ministry. In closing, we want to thank Brendanites for their response to our request that they do their best to fulfill their pledges in a timely way; pledge income rebounded in May, allowing us to face the new demands on our resources with confidence.

Senior Warden's Corner

Many wonderful suggestions emerged from our parish-wide Zoom meeting on Wednesday evening. Among them was a proposal that St. Brendan's should adopt and post on our Web page an explicit statement about racial inequity and police brutality, including a commitment to developing and implementing a sustained and effective response. I endorse that idea and will work with Fr. Regis and with the Justice Ministry to bring it about.

The challenges in crafting such a document are many. The statement must be rooted in our Baptismal promises and reflect our Christian identity both for those who understand that connection and for those who do not. It should include a humble admission of our historical complicity (as a nation, as a church, and in most cases as individuals) in the systemic oppression of women and men of color "by what we have done and by what we have left undone." It should make explicit reference to the specific events that have triggered equal measures of outrage and resolve among our members. It should express our determination as Brendanites to take stock of our own past behavior; to educate ourselves in areas where our understanding is lacking; to listen more carefully to the voices of the oppressed and marginalized; and then to act—in solidarity with our Black sisters and brothers—to bring about real and effectual change. All of these elements seem indispensable, and yet the statement cannot be too long either, since the attention span of its intended audience is not limitless.

Like most people, I am no fan of documents written by committees, but a statement of this importance **needs** community-wide input, because meeting the commitments that it voices will demand community-wide involvement. If you have suggestions about what it should say (or not say), therefore, please forward them **in the next few days** to Fr. Regis, to Donna Aiello or Claire Grotevant, to any member of the Vestry, or to me.
