The Priest's Corner

Welcome Daniel May & Preach Well Richard Gordon

This Sunday we welcome Daniel as our new music director and experience the ministry of lay preaching as Richard, recently licensed as a lay preacher by Bishop McConnell, will preach both liturgies.

Let me start with Richard. The Episcopal Church licenses non-ordained preachers to assist in spreading the good news in a homiletic way. Richard preached in his former Episcopal church in Delaware. He and I spoke early in Richard's arrival at St. Brendan's about his potential preaching ministry and set a pathway that hopefully would actualize this calling and materialize a day that he would preach at St. Brendan's. That day is this Sunday — and it has the blessing of our bishop.

Our second new experience is the official start of Daniel as our music director. You will notice that our gift, the state-of-the-art, grand piano, has found its place within the choir area. The choir will sing from a different area now, and there's a new, open physical feeling after a divider was removed so that Daniel can play this awesome piano, while conducting the singers and instrumentalists. The new choir arrangement makes it possible for Daniel to play and conduct at the same time and within the view of the choir.

As you observe the new look, you will notice a keyboard within reach of Daniel while benched at the piano. This is no normal keyboard. It is "our new-old organ." As some of you know, the electronics in our current organ are unreliable. Fortunately, technology has advanced so that software companies are now able to capture the sound of real, classic pipe organs. Such a company, Hauptwerk, creates exact sonic replicas of iconic pipe organs from around the world. Our "new" Hauptwerk organ is a virtual version of a fantastic pipe organ currently at St. Anne's, an old church in Birmingham, England. The organ was built in 1907 and is famous for its beautiful sound. Daniel will now lead our singing playing this incredible organ, running the software on a Mac laptop connected to a single MIDI keyboard.

A little background of our new music director. He is currently the music director at the Fairmont Pittsburgh Hotel. He recently composed the musical score for *Medieval Times*, a live show featured in venues throughout the USA and Canada. He created the

original music for over 10 IMAX films, *The Magic of Flight* and *Everest* among them. He also wrote original music for over 50 films and television movies and shows, among them: *Cheers, The Bob Newhart Show, Midnight in Paris, Family Man* and *Brothers* & *Sisters*, to name a few.

I'm sure you will all find Daniel's musical presence among us uplifting, holy and a draw. Please welcome him with your support and expectations. He plans to play prelude music 15 minutes before the liturgy starts. He will take requests and will do his best to bring them into the liturgy. Many of these will be showcased before the service. He welcomes dedications during the preludes. For example, say your mother who's passed has a birthday coming up. You can dedicate a song or hymn to your mom, and Daniel will play it for all to hear before liturgy starts. My sense is that many will feel it worthwhile to come early, just to experience this wonderful music option.

Thank you, Lord, for bringing our two friends and brothers into our midst. We are truly thankful for them, and we ask that they bless us for many years with their gifts and ministries.



Seeking Members of the Nominating Committee for the next Bishop of Pittsburgh

Our bishop, the Right Reverend Dorsey McConnell, has announced his retirement date in 2021. In discussions with the bishop, the Standing Committee has revised the schedule for the election and consecration of the ninth bishop of Pittsburgh.

January 23, 2021: Special convention to elect the next bishop February 13, 2021: Snow date for the election, if needed

June 5 or 12, 2021: Consecration of the ninth bishop of Pittsburgh

The Standing Committee of the diocese will appoint a Nominating Committee to search for candidates and present them for final approval by the Standing Committee and ultimately election at the special convention. At this time, we ask that you recommend to us the names of any individuals who could capably serve on the Nominating Committee.

More details about the tasks of the Nominating Committee, together with an application form, are available on the diocesan website at www.episcopalpgh.org.

Applications are <u>due by February 1, 2020</u>. In the coming months, please consult the diocesan website and the diocesan newsletter "Grace Happens" for news about the process to call our next bishop.
